



It is with immense pride and joy that I address this august gathering to present the annual report for the academic year 2024-25 which has been an eventful and successful year for Vimala Hridaya ISC School. This occasion serves as a reflection of our collective journey, achievements, and aspirations. As I present

this year's report, join me on a stroll through the events, milestones, and successes that have defined the past year. Allow me to take you through the highlights of the journey.

The 16th Graduation Ceremony on 25th March was a proud milestone, graced by Chief Guest Rev. Dr. Silvie Antony, Principal of Infant Jesus School, and President Rev. Dr. Sr. Celcy Mary FIH, Assistant Superior General. The ICSE results for 2023-24 were remarkable, with 97 students appearing for the exams. Alisha Sabeer emerged as the topper with an impressive 97%. Among the students, 58 secured distinctions, 26 achieved first-class results, and 5 earned second-class standings.

Equally commendable were the ISC results, where all 52 students passed, maintaining a 100% success rate. In the Science stream, Afsal B topped with 92%, while Sreeprasad led the Commerce stream with 85.25%. Out of the total, 36 students achieved distinctions, and 16 earned first-class results. These accomplishments are a testament to our students' dedication and our teachers' unwavering commitment.

On 22nd May, Vimala Hridaya ISC School joyfully welcomed the new Principal, Sr. Herma Mary, in the esteemed presence of Mother General Rexia Mary, Sr. Lija Mary, and the Staff secretary, Ms. Jacqueline D'Cruz. This momentous occasion marked the beginning of a promising new chapter for our institution, filled with hope and dedication to continued excellence.

With the campus alive with excitement, the new academic year began on 3rd June, celebrated through a vibrant Welcome Day adorned with colorful decorations, and a ribbon-cutting ceremony led by our principal. A week later, on 10th June, the KG section reopened,

marking the start of a delightful journey for our youngest learners. On 12th June, the 11th standard students joined, adding to the energy and enthusiasm of the new academic year, further enriching the diverse learning environment.

We celebrated World Environment Day with a tree-planting ceremony led by Mrs. Sneha S Mohan from the Agricultural Department, followed by engaging in drawing and essay competitions to inspire environmental awareness among our students.

In a heartwarming celebration of literature, our language teachers organized a Reading Day for students from classes V to XII, where they engaged in a variety of activities to ignite and share their passion for reading.

World Drugs Day was observed with great enthusiasm as our 12th-standard students took a powerful pledge and performed a vibrant flash mob, raising awareness and standing united against drug use.

At the CISCE Zone A Carroms Championship on July 6th, our players excelled and emerged as first runner-up. Mohammed Irfan and Irfan Jasim from Standard XII claimed Gold in Doubles, while Shinaz of Standard VII D and Mohammed Nihal of class VII C also bagged Gold in Doubles. In Boys Singles, Vishnu Omanakuttan from Standard XII clinched Gold, and Arman Khan from XII Science secured Silver, making an impressive mark in the category. Alfiya from Standard XII earned Silver, and Diya Fathima secured Bronze in the Girls Singles.

At the CISCE Kerala Region Carroms Championship on August 19th, Shinaz and Nihal brought home Bronze, while Irfan Jasim, Mohammed Irfan, Vishnu Omanakuttan, and Alfiya earned Gold and got the privilege to compete at the CISCE National Championship in Uttar Pradesh.

In CISCE zone A athletics, Mohammed Ali from Standard XI dominated with Gold in Javelin Throw, Silver in Discus Throw, and Bronze in the 400m race, while Ashlin Maxon from Standard VIII A secured Silver in Long Jump, and Mohammed Sinan from Standard VIII B won Bronze in the 400m race. Rawdha Fathima from Standard VI B also earned Bronze in Long Jump.

At the Kollam District Amateur Athletic Championship, Ashlin Maxon of Standard VIII A claimed first place in the triathlon, while Rawdha Fathima of Standard VI B secured third place, showcasing their exceptional talent.

On July 10th, our school proudly

hosted the Zone A Chess Championship. Mohammed Nihal of class XII Science earned a commendable second place. The event was graced by our Chief Guest, Rev. Dr. Johnny C. M., Principal of St. Vincent's, Keralapurram.

Our school organized the Malayala Manorama and Santa Monica Read & Win Quiz Competition on 15th July, where brilliance shone brightly. Irfana Fathima of Standard XI Science secured the first place, followed by Mohammed Afiyan of Standard XII Science in second, and Mohammed Afsal of Standard XI Science in third.

The National Education Society organized a vibrant Book Fair on 6th and 7th August, where students eagerly immersed themselves in the joy of reading.

“Goodness how does he live in these conditions? Urgh!” Andrea scoffed wrinkling her nose in disgust. She paced around her room, planning out her next move.


“Should I break in? no, maybe not.. I don’t want to get arrested”

IS WATER A BIOMOLECULE?



IS GRAVITY EXISTING IN SPACE?

Yes.

The moment we ask this question, we're not just challenging a misconception—we are stepping into the deepest truths of the physical universe. Gravity is not something that disappears once we leave Earth's surface. It is not confined to mountains or masses. In fact, gravity is the invisible architecture of space itself. The further we go into the cosmos, the more we realise: space is gravity's canvas.

The Myth of “Zero Gravity” in Space

One of the most common misunderstandings is that astronauts float in space because there is “no gravity” there. But this is incorrect. In fact, gravity aboard the International Space Station (ISS), which orbits just 400 km above Earth, is about 90% as strong as it is on the ground.

So why do they float? Because they're in free fall. The ISS, and everyone inside, is falling toward Earth due to gravity—but moving sideways fast enough to keep missing it. This endless fall around Earth creates the sensation of weightlessness. It's not the absence of gravity, but gravity in action, crafting the orbit itself.

From Newton to Einstein: A Deeper Truth

Sir Isaac Newton first described gravity as a force between two masses—a theory still used in calculations like rocket launches and satellite motion. But in 1915, Albert Einstein revolutionized our understanding with his General Theory of Relativity.

Einstein showed that gravity is not a force at all—it's the curvature of spacetime caused by mass and energy. Imagine spacetime as a fabric: a heavy object like the Sun creates a dent in this fabric, and planets like Earth roll along the curves of that dent. Mass tells spacetime how to curve; curved spacetime tells mass how to move.

Evidence of Einstein: Time Dilation and Lensing

Einstein's theory predicted incredible phenomena. For example: Gravitational time dilation: Time moves slower in stronger gravity. This is proven by GPS satellites, which must adjust their clocks to match Earth-based time.

Gravitational lensing: Light bends around massive objects like galaxies, allowing us to see distant stars hidden behind them.

These aren't theories anymore. They are observable, measurable, and essential to modern technology.

Hollywood Meets Physics: Interstellar

No movie has captured the mystery of gravity like Christopher Nolan's *Interstellar*. Guided by Nobel laureate Kip Thorne, the film brought real science to life.

When the astronauts visit the ocean planet near the black hole Gargantua, time stretches dramatically. One hour on that planet equals seven years on Earth—a visual masterpiece of Einstein's time dilation. The way light swirls around the black hole, bending into a halo, is based on real gravitational lensing.

Interstellar doesn't just dramatize science—it respects it, and in doing so, reveals gravity's power to twist space and time into forms beyond human intuition.

Gravity: The Cosmic Sculptor

In space, gravity is not weaker—it is everywhere. It holds galaxies together, shapes stars, and triggers supernovae. It collapses massive stars into black holes, where even light cannot escape. It pulls the arms of galaxies into spirals and gathers galaxies into clusters and superclusters, interconnected by the cosmic web.

Without gravity, the universe would be chaotic dust. With gravity, it becomes an elegant structure: ordered, beautiful, and dynamic.

Black Holes: Where Gravity Breaks Understanding

In the heart of a black hole, gravity is so strong that spacetime folds inward, creating a singularity. Here, our physics break down. Time, space, and matter behave in ways we cannot fully explain.

This is the edge of human understanding. Beyond the event horizon of a black hole, gravity doesn't just dominate—it becomes a mystery. Is it a door to another universe? A storage for lost information? Scientists are still searching.

Gravity vs. the Universe's Expansion

After the Big Bang, the universe began expanding outward. For decades, scientists thought gravity might slow it down, or even reverse it.

But surprise: the expansion is speeding up. Some unknown force—called dark energy—is pushing the universe apart, overpowering gravity on the largest scales. Still, gravity remains the architect of structure within this cosmic inflation. It organizes everything beneath that scale—from galaxies to atoms.

The Ultimate Puzzle: Gravity and Quantum Mechanics

Einstein's theory is brilliant—but it clashes with quantum physics, which governs the tiniest particles. Quantum theory is probabilistic; relativity is geometric. They don't agree.

Physicists have spent decades seeking a "Theory of Everything"—something that unifies gravity and quantum mechanics. Ideas like string theory and loop quantum gravity are on the frontier, aiming to explain gravity at the smallest levels of spacetime.

Someday, this union might unlock secrets we can't even imagine today.

The Most Poetic Force

So, does gravity exist in space?

The answer is not just yes—it is profoundly, infinitely yes.

Gravity is not just present in space; it defines space. It is the silent thread that connects all things, the rhythm behind all motion, the invisible sculptor of time and place.

Wherever we look—moons, galaxies, black holes, the ticking of a satellite's clock—gravity is there. Not just acting, but defining.

Final Question

If gravity is not a force, but the bending of reality itself—then what is mass, but the power to shape the universe?



മാടത്ത് തെക്കേപ്പാട്ട് വാസുദേവൻ നായർ അഥവാ എം.ടി. എന്ന രണ്ടക്ഷരം, മലയാള സാഹിത്യത്തിനും ചലച്ചിത്രലോകത്തിനും ഒരുപോലെ പ്രിയങ്കരനായ മഹാപ്രതിഭയായിരുന്നു. നോവലിസ്റ്റ്, കഥാകൃത്ത്, തിരക്കഥാകൃത്ത്, ചലച്ചിത്ര സംവിധായകൻ, പത്രാധിപൻ എന്നിങ്ങനെ വിവിധ മേഖലകളിൽ അദ്ദേഹം തന്റെ പ്രതിഭ തെളിയിച്ചു. സാധാരണ മനുഷ്യരുടെ വേദനകളെയും ഒറ്റപ്പെടലിനെയും ആഴത്തിൽ സ്പർശിക്കുന്നതായിരുന്നു അദ്ദേഹത്തിന്റെ രചനകൾ.

1933 ഓഗസ്റ്റ് 8 ന് പൊന്നാനി താലൂക്കിലെ കൂടല്ലൂരിലെ വീട്ടിൽ ജനിച്ച എം.ടി സാമ്പത്തികമായി പിന്നാക്കം നിൽക്കുന്ന ചുറ്റുപാടുകളിലാണ് വളർന്നത്. പഠനകാലത്ത് തന്നെ സാഹിത്യത്തിൽ താൽപ്പര്യമുണ്ടായിരുന്ന അദ്ദേഹം 1957 ൽ മാതൃഭൂമി ആഴ്ചപ്പതിപ്പിൽ സബ് എഡിറ്ററായി ചേർന്നു. 1954 ൽ മാതൃഭൂമി നടത്തിയ ലോക ചെറുകഥാമത്സരത്തിൽ 'വളർത്തുമൃഗങ്ങൾ' എന്ന കഥയ്ക്ക് ഒന്നാം സമ്മാനം നേടിയത് അദ്ദേഹത്തിന്റെ എഴുത്തുജീവിതത്തിലെ വലിയ വഴിത്തിരിവായി. 1968 ൽ മാതൃഭൂമി ആഴ്ചപ്പതിപ്പിന്റെ പത്രാധിപരായ എം.ടി, 1981 ലും, 1999 ലും ആ സ്ഥാനം രാജിവെച്ചു.

'മഞ്ഞ്', 'കാലം', 'അസുരവിത്ത്'. ബാഹ്യമായ ഒരലങ്കാരങ്ങളിലും ഭ്രമിക്കാത്ത, എഴുത്തിനായി മാത്രം ജീവിച്ച ഒരു മനുഷ്യനായിരുന്നു എം.ടി. തന്റെ കഥാപാത്രങ്ങളിലൂടെ അദ്ദേഹം ഓരോ മലയാളികളുടെയും ഹൃദയത്തിൽ ഇടം നേടി. അദ്ദേഹത്തിന്റെ കൃതികളിലെ കഥാപാത്രങ്ങളും അവരുടെ ഒറ്റപ്പെടലുകളും വേദനകളും ഒരു തലമുറയിൽ നിന്ന് അടുത്ത തലമുറയിലേക്കും കൈമാറ്റം ചെയ്യപ്പെടുന്നു. അതുകൊണ്ടു തന്നെ, മലയാള സാഹിത്യത്തിന്റെ സുവർണ്ണ കാലഘട്ടത്തിലെ എഴുത്തിന്റെ പെരുന്തായി അദ്ദേഹം എന്നും ഓർമ്മിക്കപ്പെടും.
